Objective

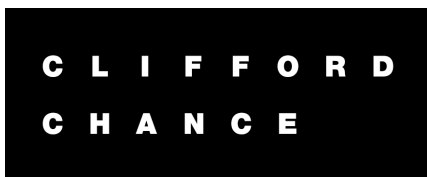
